# 2 Introduction

Snackbrands Australia Ltd Pty holds an Environment Protection Licence (EPL) from the NSW EPA for its Orchard Hills site. Under the Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997 (POEO Act), the company must develop and maintain a Pollution Incident Response Management Plan (PIRMP). This plan must be:

- Prepared, tested, and implemented in compliance with Part 5.7A of the POEO Act.
- Immediately activated if a pollution incident occurs that causes or threatens material harm to the environment.
- Kept on-site and made available to EPA officers and those responsible for implementing it.
- Partially publicly accessible, either via a website or upon written request, as required by clause 98D of the POEO (General) Regulation 2009.

The PIRMP must follow EPA guidelines and relevant legislation.


